SCHOLARSHIP The Cedarwood Association is pleased to announce that it will again be able to award a \$300 scholarship in May 1989. A graduating senior of any high school whose family has been dues paying members of the Association for any two consecutive years since 1983 is eligible. The student must be enrolled in an accredited post-secondary school by September 1989. Applications may be obtained in person or by writing to the Public Services Department at Waltham High School late in January 1989. The deadline for submitting applications will be in late February or early March. Watch for an announcement from the Public Services Department.

- 3) Denial of a Recreation Department Special Permit requested by Brandeis to use the Cedarwood Playground for organized athletics;
- 4) Abatement of nuisance parking by Brandeis students in the neighborhood; and,
- 5) Re-establishment of the Cedarwood Association scholarship.
