Good News from the front line! It looks like the daylillies made it through their first winter and are going strong at the pillars. Making their first appearance are the bulbs and the irises planted last fall by Committee members Irv and Eleanor Robbins. The irises are courtesy of fellow gardener **Jodie Osgood**. Toward the end of May the city's Forestry crew will fill the planters with assorted annuals.

In the Backyard This year we're focusing on the Cedarwood playground and its surrounding areas. Our plans include planting daylillies along the fence at the playground entrance as well as near the sign. Neighboring gardeners **Rebecca and Chuck McCullogh** donated the daylillies. We'll also be planting bulbs (and moving the existing bulbs) around the small tree near the water fountain. And to round things out we'll be planting flowering annuals under the playground sign as well. The **Home Depot** store's Garden Dept. Manager - John Enos has generously agreed to donate the annuals and mulch.

An important part of our plans include the planting of a Mountain Laurel shrub in the corner of the playground, courtesy of our neighbors at **Brandeis University**. This was made possible through the combined efforts of Shelley Kaplan, Ruth Iannazzo, and George Bogosian, of Brandeis.

And finally, in an experimental vein, we will be planting wildflower seeds along the section of the Brandeis fence on Hamilton Road, nearest to the playground. If this works out, we will try to plant more sections each year.
