# Cedarwood Association Annual Meeting Minutes May 1, 2018 – Woodside's Garage

## I. Welcome by Co-Presidents

## II. Treasurer's Report and Approval of Minutes

- Minutes from April 27, 2017 meeting unanimously approved
- Both the general fund and the scholarship fund had revenues that exceeded expenses
- All funds have been moved to a Watertown Savings Bank account
- Scholarship pays out \$1,500 to one high school senior per year and minimum years of donations to association is required to qualify

#### **III. Announcements**

- Jake and Joe's fundraiser on May 4, 2017 was a success and was helpful in providing scholarship funds
- Cedarwood Association is now a 503(c)7 organization (a social organization) and donations to it are not tax deductible
- Changes to the board:
  - Tash Ross is stepping down as secretary and position will be taking over by Sara Vautour
  - Annie Huff is leaving neighborhood so a replacement is needed for her work
  - o Kevin Delaney is stepping away as he is expecting triplets very soon

## IV. Mayor Jeanette A. McCarthy

- Door to door solicitation advertising clean energy
  - Not associated with the city
  - o Must sign up with police department in order to solicit in the city
  - Joseph Pedulla is the city's purchasing agent
    - Working on selecting a vendor for the city to utilize clean energy
    - Once vetted he will present to the City Council
    - No recommendation available yet
- Children's hospital infrastructure upgrades
  - Process for construction at the hospital is transparent as a call for comment is requested for those within close proximity to the construction site
  - Meetings and public hearings are listed on city website and notices are put in the newspaper
  - Garage built which was approved by the mayor
  - Zone change for accessory building
    - Would have permitted a no height limitation so buildings could have been built as high as needed
    - Much neighborhood opposition near Highland Street and Sharon Street
  - Plan for bridge is being reworked
  - Originally a plan for an inpatient expansion but change in plan is now geared towards more outpatient
- Hotel across the street from Margaritas on Moody Street
  - RFP to build hotels with stores
  - City Council is working with hotel to finalize the plan
  - Plan is going forward with modifications from original proposed plan

- Dosa Factory of Moody Street status
  - Still "coming soon"
- Opposition to "No Turn On Red" sign at the stop light at the Cedarwood gates
  - State owned signal
  - State came out to review after complaints were brought forth but decision not to remove because it would be too unsafe to do so
  - o People are not adhering to sign and no police are enforcing it
  - Other options include putting warning signage on Stow Street to alert other side of the street
  - Mayor will write another letter and call state to revisit
- Update on new high school
  - Mayor contacted Stigmatines again but is waiting on an answer
  - Need to provide City Council with answers so nudging Stigmatines to respond
  - Education plan is complete so can move forward with a building plan once location is determined

## Rooming houses

- o Illegal as a violation of zoning but few allegedly exist in neighborhood
- Renting out rooms to Brandeis students
- Mayor to send letter to Brandeis if necessary
- Noted on Virginia Road, Florence Road, Hamilton Road and Westgate Road and Mayor to investigate
- Basement renovations are a red flag and require close inspection especially when kitchen is included as opportunity for renters in that space
- Bear Hill Road and Second Avenue
  - New water main
  - o Mayor to check with National Grid if all of their scheduled work is complete
  - Plan to pave Bear Hill Road
  - Storage facility in place of old Uno's
- Updates to city website
  - Posting updates on specific projects
  - o Information is still difficult to navigate and find out details
  - CPW and Engineering projects to combine
  - Schedule is posted for upcoming Public Works projects
- 117 bridge and potholes
  - o Area is not completely paved but in process of getting quote for remainder of paving
  - Mayor will contact the state for the large pot holes
  - MEPA plans for optional 117 bridge or traffic light at Totten Pond rotary
- 1265 Main Street complex
  - Agreed to pay for bridge which would open up traffic
  - Takings done
  - o Proceeding along and work could align Bear Hill Road with Green Street
  - Additional 400,000 sq ft to build and project is coming together
- 40B residential development on Jones Road
  - Owned by Boston Properties
  - Development is in Weston but traffic affects Waltham
  - Aids in affordable housing

- Paperwork was updated which would cause all traffic from units through Jones Road and into Waltham
- Weston's response was that Waltham was "in a position to handle traffic"
- Sheridan Street pot holes
  - o Few owners have complained about significant pot holes
  - City fills pot holes on main streets but for private way each home owner owns to the middle of the road
  - With multiple owners on this private way a petition to have road paved would need to be approved but all home owners
- Bike path
  - Good news!
  - Constructed by same person who built the river walk
  - Portion in design bid in the works to be constructed next year
  - Beaver Street to Belmont line not yet in process
  - Polaroid to Weston not yet done
- Prospect Street
  - Congested and what can be done to alleviate traffic
  - Mayor to check on potential resolutions

## V. City Councilor Kristine Mackin (Ward 7)

- New to ward 7, started in January
- Feel free to contact if any questions or issues
- Traffic related items
  - o Attended May 17 traffic meeting regarding concerns with South Street
  - Plans in cooperation with other wards where streets cross districts so all on the same page
  - o Summit Ave paving waiting on cost reductions before proceeding
- Off leash dog area at Cedarwood playground in fenced in area behind basketball court
- Brandeis
  - Potential to invite someone from Brandeis to next meeting to identify if any large projects are going on
  - Can neighborhood people use pool or other facilities?
  - One on one swim lessons with the swim team is a great resource if want to utilize
- Video game arcade potentially coming to Moody Street
  - More of a video game reseller rather than arcade
  - Come before Council for a zone change
  - Some opposition to proposal
- Parking garage to support new hotel on Moody Street
  - No additional parking but no loss in parking either
- Petitions for increasing liquor licenses
  - o Potential 8 new beer and wine licenses and 8 new all alcohol licenses
  - Potential for 2 more package store licenses but brings fear of potential marijuana shops so some opposition exists
- Laser tag coming to recreation center at former South Middle School
  - Coming in May
  - Fridays and Saturdays for kids
